

Early in Careers (EiC) Core Competency Programme

For 2021 the GHSL is looking to introduce a new stream of professional development opportunities for Early in Career (EiC) H&S practitioners in addition to our existing forums.

Partnering with IMPAC, the GHSL is offering a new Early in Careers (EiC) Core Competency Programme designed for new H&S practitioners who are starting their careers in health, safety, and wellbeing.

The purpose of programme modules will be to build core H&S competency using a structured learning and workshop approach targeted at Early in Career (EiC) H&S practitioners.

The programme will consist of four workshop modules throughout 2021 which will be tailored to recognise EiC H&S practitioners specific learning needs. The overall aims of our workshops are to:

- Build core H&S capability and application.
- Provide linkages to other quarterly workshops.
- Be practical, engaging, and useful back in the office.
- Supports cross agency collaboration and connections.

About our EiC Learning Modules

Once a quarter, using a modular approach, each workshop covers a stand-alone topic, with all modules cumulatively providing a solid foundation of learning for all attendees.

These 3-hour workshops will be facilitated by IMPAC and include a range of interactive activities, discussions, and practical exercises. Each workshop module will provide a general understanding of the topic, its importance, the risks/impacts associated for the organisation or workforce.

At the end of the workshop, the EiC practitioner will be able to apply their learning in a useful way back in the office, or onsite, supported by resources supplied at the workshops.

Who can attend?

Our Early in Career Core Competency Programme is designed for and aimed at H&S practitioners who are starting their careers in roles such as graduates, co-ordinators, administrators, and advisors. However, anyone can attend from public sector agencies.

How much does it cost?

- For GHSL member agencies the cost is \$1,165*+GST (For all four modules). (*Costs will be reduced to \$780 +GST per attendee, if there are 30 attendees booked)
- Workshop numbers: Minimum of 20 attendees and maximum of 30 attendees.

Payment: 50% of the workshop costs is due upon registration. Remaining 50% of workshop costs is due after 1 July 2021.
