2026 CAPABILITY PROGRAMMES - A QUICK REMINDER

- HSE Global NEBOSH workshops In addition to the Wellington based NEBOSH workshops, HSE Global is also running workshops at the Fonterra site in Auckland, in February 2026. GHSL member agency staff are invited to join them and will be eligible for a \$1,500 discount to the usual price. To register for either set of workshops, click HSE Global. The GHSL and HSE Global are also working on the potential to run a NEBOSH course in Christchurch watch this space.
- Officer Development Our March 2026 workshop is now fully booked we will have a waitlist for any spots that become available for this date. The August 2026 workshop dates still have places available, so make sure your senior leaders register soon.
- Early in Careers Health and Safety Certificate is back for 2026. Our <u>+IMPAC facilitated</u> workshop will run from May August and provides 12-16 hours of professional development and lead to an NZQA level 3 micro-credential certificate, all for \$1,165 pp.

RECAP FOR THE YEAR



The end of the year is a great time to reflect and think about all the has been achieved in the year. Whilst 2025 has not been the easiest year, I am proud of the work the GHSL, often working in partnership with member agencies and external providers, has accomplished in the last 12 months:

- Our summer intern programme has now had over 120 interns, with many going on to work in the public sector.
- Our Tier 2 HSW Leaders Programme is now 15-months old and undergoing formal evaluation.
- Our new GHSL Agency H&S Resource Hub has successfully launched, providing member agencies a secure place to hold and share their strategies, policies, procedures and guidance.
- The Safe-Gov App has been moved into production, with a hard launch to CEs planned for early in the New Year.
- The 2025 GHSL H&S Rep Conference was very well received and for the first time, the 2026 Conference will be fully sponsored, meaning it can remain free for attendees.
- We hosted two Officer Development courses and an Early in Careers programme and have dates set for our 2026 courses.
- Engagement across the public sector has increased, with there now being 62 GHSL members.
- We have partnered with HSE Global to bring NEBOSH courses to Auckland and Wellington, discounted by \$1,500 for our member agencies.
- With support from DIA and MBIE, we are working with HSE Global to re-skin some H&S Rep online learning modules, which will be available in 2026.
- We established a Driving Safety Working group.
- We have run a successful series of forums and communities of practice, largely with individual agencies leading the events.
